

## ***What Does the Proposed Federal Budget Mean for Education Funding in New York State?***

The Administration's proposed FY2005 Education Budget does not include approximately \$204 million in funding for upstate New York that was promised in Title I of the landmark No Child Left Behind Act. The Education Bill intends to help schools hire and retain highly-qualified teachers, improve curricula, repair buildings and make other improvements; however, the new budget proposal fails to provide the funding that was authorized to meet these goals. **Below is a county-by-county breakdown of how the proposed budget impacts each county in upstate New York.**

**Capital Region:** *The Administration's funding proposal for Title I of the landmark "No Child Left Behind Act" would send \$37.8 million to schools in the Capital Region, \$20.1 million less than what was originally promised.*

**Central New York:** *The Bush Administration's funding proposal for Title I of the landmark "No Child Left Behind Act" would send \$44.9 million to schools in Central New York, \$24.3 million less than what was originally promised.*
