How Many Companies Has the Manufacturing Extension Partnership Helped in New York?

Over the last decade, more than 1400 companies in upstate New York have taken advantage of the Manufacturing Extension Partnership program (MEP), which provides consulting and training services to small to medium size manufacturing companies to help them stay afloat. 130,000 manufacturing jobs have been lost in New York since January 2001, and local companies face growing competition from overseas. US Senator Charles E. Schumer is pushing for an increase of \$21.8 million for this critical program, which is credited with creating 625 and retaining 2,041 jobs in New York; increasing sales by \$46 million; and realizing \$13 million in cost savings for participating companies in 2003 alone.

The following report shows the county by county breakdown of companies taking advantage of the MEP program since 1995 and illustrates the number of manufacturing jobs that have been lost over the past three years.

Capital Region: Over the last decade, the Manufacturing Extension Partnership program has helped 152 companies in the Capital Region to stay afloat. Since May 2001, the Capital Region has lost 5,650 manufacturing jobs.

Central New York: Over the last decade, the Manufacturing Extension Partnership program has helped 151 companies in Central New York to stay afloat. Since May 2001, Central New York has lost 10,260 manufacturing jobs.

Rochester/Finger Lakes: Over the last decade, the Manufacturing Extension Partnership program has helped 192 companies in the Rochester/Finger Lakes area to stay afloat. Since May 2001, the Rochester/ Finger Lakes area has lost 18,720 manufacturing jobs.

8,700 manufacturing jobs.
