

Protecting New York Manufacturing Jobs

The New York State Department of Labor estimates that New York State has lost tens of thousands of manufacturing jobs since January 2001. The JOBS bill that Senator Schumer is supporting would give manufacturers a 3% tax relief on domestic manufacturing so that manufacturing companies will keep their jobs in the United States. *The following report provides county-by-county estimates of manufacturing job losses in New York over the past three years.*

Capital Region: Since 2001, 5,990 manufacturing jobs in the Capital Region have been lost.
