Project Purpose as originally requested in Legi-Mate: Worker's Justice Project (WJP) is requesting funds to design and plan a pilot version of the Deliverista HUB. The pilot will test a prototype of the first-of-its-kind indoor electric charging station, programming, and workforce development to professionalize the app delivery industry. WJP also wants to create "hubs" for gig workers throughout the city. These hubs could be used by workers to charge their bikes, phones and batteries and serve as resource hubs for gig workers. NYC will retrofit these structures using newsstands that are no longer operational.

Request for technical change: Change recipient entity name from "Workers Justice Project" to its fiscal sponsor "Third Sector New England Inc. (TSNE)."
